- Ames School 1:1 Laptop Initiative
- How are we using the laptops? The fifth grade is using the laptops for essays, I-Calendar, six-minute solutions for reading, wiki spaces
- The laptops have made students more collaborative, responsible, and organized
- How would the laptops be used for homework? There would be more time devoted to projects by bringing the laptops home. They would not be used for internet use-

Administration reports - Principal Lieggi

- Thank you for the Artist in Residence Bill Buczinsky.?? The program was very good and the kids loved it-
- Ames had a lockdown drill on Thursday, January 28
- PUMPED behavior incentive program had a hula hoop contest. You must have no conduct referrals to participate. To date, there have been eight conduct referrals. Last year at this date there were 20-
- Haiti Relief Fund - Ames has raised more than $\$ 600$. The money went to the American Red Cross
- If you have extra snow pants or boots, please bring them in to donate-
- The classes are making Valentine's Day cards for the soldiers in Iraq
- Presentation of ISAT data (2009) -
- Good scoresd are a result in part of consistency in teaching staff and administration-
- We analyze tFhe test data for school improvement purposes. One important goal is to see a jump from the percentage of students who are "meeting standards" into the "exceeding standards" group
- Another goal is to see $90 \%$ of the third, fourth and fifth grades meet and exceed for three straight years
- Fifth grade math is also an area of focus. Teachers are working together on strategies, pacing and challenges
- Third grade reading had a slight dip by $1.4 \%$. The teachers are working on inference and short responses and providing more intervention to struggling readers-
- Fourth grade scores were up in all areas. The focus will be on non-fiction and technical reading strategies and on problem solving-
- There will be an evening parent workshop on Tuesday, February 9 in the multi-purpose room-

Dr. Lamberson

- Thank you for your positive response to the landscape project at Ames. Thank you for responding to the survey about future kindergartners and preschoolers.
- The 2010-11 calendar will be similar to this year but we won't be following RB's Christmas break
- Lockdown drill - Our kids need to establish a skill set for this. If there was a school lockdown, School Reach will be the primary way of communication from Dr. Lamberson once he has contact with Colleen.
- The Board is letting Dr. Lamberson is looking at a potential 4-5 year plan for infrastructure improvements without a tax referendum
- Enrollment is just under 1530 students. Projected Kindergarten enrollment for 2010-11 is 130 to low 140s-
- Question - When will voting be moved to the North Riverside VFW Hall? Stephanie Schulte is trying to initiate this with Cook County
- Crossing Guards - District 96 is in conversation with the village on how to resolve this issue. If District 96 takes this on, it would cost about \$118,000 out of District 96's budget-
