Nurse's Report

Mrs. Sonja Lewis, School Nurse

- Head Lice
 - A few cases have been reported by parents but no lice have been found for any classes checked at school (notices will be sent home if found at school)
 - Evidence of head lice
 - Scratching the scalp a lot
 - Nits look like dandruff but are very difficult to remove
 - Small lice or large gray or brown lice
 - Prevention
 - Keep coats on hooks at school (Do not leave on floor)
 - Put hats inside coat sleeve
 - Consider putting hair in braids
- Vaccines
 - New mandates for two doses of Chicken Pox and MMR for Kindergarten, and grades 6 and 9)
 - You may have received a notice
- Viruses
 - o D96 has not received instructions from the CDC regarding Ebola
 - o Best protections:
 - Good hand washing (20 seconds or sing the ABC's)
 - Cough into elbow
 - Try not to touch eyes, nose, or mouth
 - Fever at 100 or higher keep student home from school until the child is fever-free (without medication) for 24 hours. Siblings that do not have a fever may attend school.
 - Children that are vomiting or have diarrhea should stay home.

- Undercover Boss
 - o Dr. Sharma-Lewis will substitute for teachers in the district, so the teachers can observe other teachers in order to learn from one another

- o Dr. Sharma- Lewis reviewed and highlighted objectives in the 3 goal areas

 - o BOE to appoint architect

- Senate Bill 16 (SB 16)
 - The bill has passed the Senate and can be called by the House at any time (but most likely this Spring)
 - o Considered by critics to be a Robin Hood mindset
 - o District 96 will lose about 74.6% of state funding if the bill passes (a reduction of \$789,000)
 - We are currently funded 80% by local taxes
 - There will be no increase in education funding by the state
 - Authors of SB16 greatly underestimated how the impact would cut funding for special education and other targeted, categorical grants
 - Contact our State Representative

 - Thank you for Ames support for Early Release Mondays for professional development
 - o Teachers are meeting across grade level and across the district
 - o Specials teachers are also writing curriculum to include CCSS
 - Most recent professional development topic was differentiating instruction in the classroom
- Implementation of CCSS in the classroom
 - o K-5 flexible math groups
 - Guided, small group instruction based on strands of the CCSS
 - MAP data will be used to form groups
 - Groups may be instructed at centers within the classroom or switch classrooms for instruction
 - The eventual goal is for a school schedule that allows for instructional groups to move across grade levels
 - Teachers have problem-solved to find 60 minutes of additional math instruction time per week for this guided instruction
 - This method of focused instructional time was implemented at Hollywood and Central last year with great success

 - o Teachers sent letters for access to My Math in the last few days

 - Approximately 112 students throughout the year
